His Excellency the Chairman of First Meeting of the League of Nations Council in Geneva.

Dear Sir:—
We undersigned earnestly desire that your excellency will kindly present before the meeting of the League of Nations Council in Geneva the following proposals:

That in order to promote true friendship between nations based upon correct understanding of their peoples toward each other an international education council shall be convened at an earliest opportunity under the auspice of the League of Nation.

That in such a council there shall immediately be formulated a plan to set up a permanent bureau of international education with various committees. One of

One of sach committees, appointment of which is in our opinion most urgent, is the committee on the critical examination of text books. The bureau shall also be charged with the duty to convene annually delegates to the international education council.
