## 報告アブストラクト (概要)

The term *kokoro* ('heart' or 'soul') is now widely used to express mental health or psychiatry. Despite its positive effects, *kokoro* plays only a limited (if any) role in destignatising mental illness or improving public mental health literacy in Japan. To navigate the conundrum, I have conducted an immersive ethnographic study of a variety of self-help groups (SHGs) that address problems or concerns including drug addiction, *hikikomori*, *hattatsu shōgai*, eating disorders, OCD, emotions and suicide grief.

In this talk, I will first explain my previous book project on gendered precarious work, *Temporary and Gig Economy Workers in China and Japan* (Oxford University Press 2023), before focusing on key themes arising from *tōjisha*'s narratives across different SHGs based in the Tokyo metropolitan area. Special emphasis is placed on the role of gender (and its intersections with other inequality variables) in grasping complex social suffering, with a view to exploring mental health challenges confronting contemporary Japan.

## Huiyan Fu 氏の経歴 (Bio)

Huiyan Fu (PhD, Social Anthropology, University of Oxford) is Senior Lecturer/Associate Professor at University of Essex. She is currently visiting researcher at the Ohara Institute for Social Research, Hosei University.

Her main research interests lie in precarious work, social-health inequalities, and critical management studies. She is the author of *An Emerging Non-Regular Labour Force in Japan: The Dignity of Dispatched Workers* (Routledge 2011) and the editor of *Temporary Agency Work and Globalisation* (Routledge 2015) and *Temporary and Gig Economy Workers in China and Japan* (Oxford University Press 2023). Her work also appears in journals such as *Human Relations*, *Gender & Society*, and *British Journal of Industrial Relations*.
